SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Abbreviations: [DP] – Rules for which the penalties are at the discretion of the protest committee.
[NP] - means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 World Sailing Offshore Sailing Regulations (OSR) Cat 4 with life raft will apply.
- 1.3 Local regulations will apply concerning safe navigation in close proximity of moorings, commercial and military vessels restricted in their ability to manoeuvre, and dive vessels. Fowey Harbour byelaws are available at <https://foweyharbour.co.uk/safety/>
[DP] In the event of a complaint received from a Harbour Authority, the race committee will lodge a protest or submit a report to the protest committee.
- 1.4 The following rules are changed:

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- 1.5 IRC rule 22.4 is changed to remove the restriction on crew numbers and weight.
- 1.6 The use of auto pilots and autom. steering devices will be allowed. This changes RRS 52.
- 1.7 In the event of conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, then the SIs will prevail. This changes RRS 63.5 (c).

2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0830 on the day of the race. They will be posted online on the official COGS noticeboard - www.cogsracing.org.uk/ and the RCYC website at - www.royalcornwallyachtclub.org On the water/Racing Events/COGS Racing Events, however on the day of the race any changes will be made via the COGS Whatsapp Group.
- 2.2 The race committee may also broadcast verbal instructions on marine VHF radio channel 69 and they may also be included on WhatsApp group messaging. Failure to receive a broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 61.1(a).

3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted:
 - a) on the official COGS notice board located online at www.cogsracing.org.uk.
 - b) online at the RCYC website - www.royalcornwallyachtclub.org On the water/Racing Events/COGS Racing Events.
 - c) on the COGS Whatsapp Group - especially for changes to SIs on the day of the race.
- 3.2 No notices will be posted after 08:30 on the day of the race.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee intends to monitor and communicate with competitors on VHF channel 69.
- 3.4 Failure to hear a broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 61.1(a).
- 3.5 [DP] From the first warning signal (for your class) until the end of your race, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4 CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.

5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Pre-start abandonment signals made ashore will be displayed on the RCYC signals mast.
- 5.2 IC flag "L" displayed over flag "Z" at the RCYC will indicate a change to the sailing instructions.

6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 Separate starts will be held for IRC and YTC handicap classes.
- 6.2 IRC will start first.
- 6.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the IRC class is 10:00 hrs.
- 6.4 The time of the warning signal for the YTC handicap class will be the time of the starting signal of the IRC class.

7 CLASS FLAGS

- 7.1 Boats shall display their class flag beneath IC flag "Z" on the backstay or mainsail leech as follows:
 - (a) IRC - IC numeral pennant "1"
 - (b) YTC - IC flag "E"

8 RACING AREA

- 8.1 The racing area will be the Cornish coast from Manacle Point to Fowey, and north of latitude 50° N.

9 COURSES

- 9.1 The course will be selected from the list of courses shown in Addendum A, and will depend on wind strength and direction.
- 9.2 The course identifier will be broadcast by the race committee on marine VHF radio channel 69, and the WhatsApp group messaging commencing approximately 10 minutes before the warning signal and repeated at intervals until the warning signal is displayed. Failure to receive this broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 61.1(a).
- 9.3 Shortening, Abandoning or Changing the Course after the start.
The race committee may use VHF broadcasts or WhatsApp Group messaging in place of flag signals for shortening, abandoning or changing the course, This changes Rules 32 and 33. Failure to receive this broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 61.1(a).

10 MARKS

- 10.1 Marks are described in Addendum B.
- 10.2 If any mark is missing then a virtual mark shall be considered to exist at the position given in Addendum B. A virtual mark shall be treated as if it were a mark.
Appendix WP applies (World Sailing/Docs/2025-28 App WP Rules for Waypoints Jan 2025).
- 10.3 When data from electronic positioning fixing systems are used to determine the position and track of a boat for the purpose of verifying compliance with the rules, precedence shall be given to data from the boat's primary navigation system.
- 10.4 Boats are strongly advised to make a photograph of a relevant navigation system display to verify compliance with the rules.

11 OBSTRUCTIONS

- 11.1 Black Rock and Pendennis Point – competitors should be aware of the shallow waters around these obstructions.
- 11.2 [NP] Commercial shipping: Moving exclusion zones around commercial vessels constricted by their draft or size are designated obstructions. Such exclusion zones extend to 100m on all sides of the vessel and include tugs, pilot boats and safety boats escorting the vessel. No competitor is at any time to enter the exclusion zone, and, if becalmed, is to use their engine or other means of propulsion to move out of the way. This should only be sufficient to move out of the exclusion zone, and the distance travelled should be the shortest necessary to keep clear. Competitors who unnecessarily interfere with shipping bring the sport into disrepute and shall be reported by the race committee under RRS 69 – Misconduct.
- 11.3 Diving activity. Exclusion zones extend 30m around a dive boat displaying international code flag "A", an orange pillar mark indicating a diver beneath the surface, and a diver on the surface. No boat is at any time to enter the exclusion zone.
- 11.4 Navigation. Cannis & Gwineas cardinal buoys shall be passed on their correct navigational sides at all times. No boat shall sail between Cannis or Gwineas Rocks and the nearby shore.

12 THE START

- 12.1 Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal. Start times will be as follows:

- 12.2 No visual signals will be made – this changes RRS 26.
Starting signals, including a countdown, will be made by the race committee on VHF ch 69. Failure to receive this broadcast will not be grounds for redress – this changes RRS 61.1(a)

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- 12.3 No visual individual or general recall signals will be displayed. This changes RRS 29. Any OCS (on course side) boats at the start signal will be broadcast by the race committee on VHF channel 69 if they can be identified. Failure to announce sail numbers and failure of boats to receive this broadcast will not be grounds for redress – this changes RRS 61.1 (a).
- 12.4 The starting line will be a line extending east on a transit formed by the orange triangle and the signals mast on the east side of Pendennis Point. The line will be bounded at the eastern end by Black Rock beacon and at the western end by the shore.
- 12.5 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- 12.6 For the purposes of the definition of “Start” and “Finish” the term “hull” is to include a boat’s bowsprit in its normal position. This changes RRS 21.1, 29.1, 30 and 44.2.
- 12.7 A boat that does not start within 20 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS (did not start). This changes RRS 28.1, A5.1 and A5.2.

13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE – not used.

14 THE FINISH

- 14.1 The finish line will be a line in Fowey harbour extending from the Royal Fowey Yacht Club (RFYC) signals mast to the southern extremity of the “Yellow Ship Buoy” on the eastern side of the fairway.
- 14.2 Boats should record their finishing time, and the sail numbers, or names, of the boats next ahead and next behind respectively, and submit this information to the RFYC race office on VHF Ch M2. In the event no response is received, then by text to 07742 155853 and by email to committee@fowey sailing.org

15 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 15.1 RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

16 TIME LIMITS [AND TARGET TIMES]

- 16.1 The time limit for both classes is 1830.
- 16.2 Boats finishing later than the time limit will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2.

17 HEARING REQUESTS

- 17.1 For both classes, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat has finished or after the race time limit, whichever is earlier.
- 17.2 Details should be lodged in writing at the race office in RFYC. Protests and requests for redress shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 17.3 Notices will be posted at the race office in RFYC no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.

18 SCORING

- 18.1 Scoring will be as section 7 in the NOR.
- 18.2 RRS Rule A5.3 will apply.

19 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 19.1 Crew Lists:
- All boats shall report their name, sail number and number of persons on board via VHF Ch. 69 to the race officer on Saturday 12^h April no later than 10 minutes before the first scheduled warning signal. Radio silence shall be kept after this time except if called by the race committee or in an emergency.
 - A full list of crew embarked must be held by a shore-based contact. The name and telephone number of the contact shall be e-mailed to kvnmaclean@yahoo.com, no later than 30 minutes before the start of the race.

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- 19.2 Retirement. A boat that retires from the race or is unable to cross the finish line before the time limit shall notify the race committee or the RFYC as follows:
Falmouth race committee - VHF Ch. 69 & 07733457496.
RFYC race office - VHF Ch. M2 or Text 07742 155853
- 19.3 Flag V for Search and Rescue will not apply. This changes RRS 37.

20 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT – not used

21 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 21.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time by the Organising Authority for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.

22 SUPPLIED BOATS – not used.

25 TRASH DISPOSAL - not used

27 HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS – not used

28 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS – not used

29 PRIZES

- 29.1 Prizes will be given as listed in the COGS 2025 NOR 8.
- 29.2 Prize-giving on Saturday 12th April. COGS crews should meet on the terrace at the Fowey Gallants SC. The prize-giving will be held as soon as possible after all yachts have finished or the time limit has expired and a time will be announced on the COGS Whatsapp group.

30 RISK STATEMENT

- 30.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone". Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions and omissions;
 - (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;

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- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend a safety briefing held for the event.
- (h) They are responsible for ensuring that their boat is equipped and seaworthy so as to be able to face extremes of weather; that there is a crew sufficient in number, experience and fitness to withstand such weather; and that the safety equipment is properly maintained, stowed and in date and is familiar to the crew.

31 INSURANCE

- 31.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

Addendum C

Supplementary information for competitors (not part of the SI)

- C1 RCYC club launch** - The launch will run from 0830 hrs on Saturday morning for competitors who wish to board their yachts at moorings in the inner harbour area. There is currently no public water taxi available in Falmouth.
- C2 Berthing in Falmouth** - Berthing is available in Falmouth Marina (01326 316620) or Channel 80), the Yacht Haven (01326 310991) or channel 80) and Port Pendennis Marina (01326 211211 or channel 80). The Yacht Haven and Falmouth Marina are the most convenient for the RCYC. The Harbour Master (01326 312285 or Channel 12, 14 and 16) has some visitor's moorings and the RCYC launch (Channel 37) will be running until about 2030 on Friday evening.
- C3 Mooring in Fowey** - Moorings are available from the Harbour Master (01726 832471 or VHF Ch. 12 and 16). A dedicated pontoon will be reserved in the harbour for COGS competitors.
- C4 Transport ashore in Fowey** - The Fowey water taxi will hopefully be in service but if not then alternative arrangements will be made and will be announced on the COGS WhatsApp Group.
